A Letter From The Pastor

Thanksgiving is known as the quintessential American holiday. Before that holiday arrives, there is another holiday in November that is meaningful to many of us- Veterans Day. Recently, I came across something I shared with Sailors aboard the JOHN F. KENNEDY when I was deployed with a Carrier Air Wing years ago. I wrote about "standing your ground" and used this illustration...

The miniseries Band of Brothers is the story of Easy Company, a U.S. Army Airborne Paratrooper division, and their World War II operations in Europe.

The miniseries was based on historian Stephen Ambrose's nonfiction book. In episode six, Easy Company is surrounded; cold, and short on ammunition and winter gear near the Belgian town of Bastogne, a crucial position in the Allied defensive line during the Battle of the Bulge (December 1944 to January 1945). Eugene Roe, one of three company medics, is scurrying to save lives—scrounging for morphine, scissors, and bandages.

While Easy Company is dug in and holding the front line, Roe discovers Joe Toye sitting in his foxhole with his boots off in the dead of winter. Roe looks at Joe's limp, discolored, and frostbitten feet and tells Joe that he could get gangrene and lose them. In this condition, Joe could have been taken off the front line to a warm bed, but instead he looks cold-eyed at Roe and says, "I ain't coming off the line, Doc." (Toye later lost his right leg when he was hit by a barrage of enemy fire while shouting for the men in his company to take cover in their foxholes.

Toye was awarded the Silver Star for his service. Easy Company went on to make it all the way to Adolph Hitler's mountaintop retreat, Eagle's Nest.)

Joe Toye stood his ground. The men of Easy Company stood their ground. Many have served in peacetime and in war because they have been motivated to serve by stories like the one above. The children of today follow their fathers, grandfathers, aunts and uncles and other family heroes who have served sacrificially. Someday, you will tell stories of your days in the United States Navy; you will get out the pictures, the medals and ribbons, and you will tell a few sea stories and plant in the hearts of the younger ones who listen, the seed of self-sacrificing service to country. Stand your ground and be proud you serve.

As hard as it is for me to believe, I wrote that over twenty years ago. And as I read it now, I realize I am the veteran telling the sea stories and there are many young members of our military "standing their ground" right now for us. We can be thankful for veterans, those now actively serving in our military, and most importantly, for a God who gives strength and courage to all who "stand their ground."

General Fund Budgeted: \$304,500 General Fund Receipts: \$325,606.39

This fund will have to cover the cost of our landscaping project that exceeds what we have in the B&G Reserve Fund.



Building & Grounds Reserve Balance: \$32,011.74

This is our most under-funded account. It will be depleted by the landscaping project. We urgently need to start building this fund for long-range projects like parking lots resurfacing and for the unknown and non-budgeted "emergencies" that pop up

unexpectedly -- like heat pump replacements.



Compassion Fund Balance: \$3,662.79

Compassion Fund YTD disbursements: \$13,059.74

Disbursements from the Compassion Fund assists local people with housing needs, food, utilities, and car repairs.



Scholarship Fund Balance: \$10,169.45

We give \$10,000 in scholarships each year. As you see, we have reached our goal for our scholarships for next June, but it is time to start building the fund for June 2027




Upcoming Chapel Highlights
